Fees

- \$225 Early registration (February to April 2)
- \$250 Registration (April 3 to July 17)
- \$275 Late registration (after July 17)

Options

- \$25 Private organ instruction—25 minutes
- \$40 Private organ instruction—50 minutes
- \$10 Instruction placement, auditions available only on August 2
- \$100 Campus housing (double occupancy)

Refunds

Participants may cancel and obtain a full refund without penalty until July 27, 2010. After that date, there is a processing fee of \$50 for each cancellation; campus housing fees are nonrefundable. Send written requests to: Organ Workshop, 161 HCEB, Provo, UT 84602.

Campus Housing (optional)

Limited double-occupancy accommodations in campus residence halls are available to workshop participants for an additional cost of \$100. The housing package includes lodging the nights of Monday, August 2, through Friday, August 6. Check-in time is after 3:00 p.m. on August 2; checkout time is before 9:00 a.m. on Saturday, August 7. Couples housing is not available on campus but can be obtained through the Courtyard by Marriott for \$89 per night (<http://cwp.marriott.com/slcpr/byucw>).
