WELCOME!

We are excited you have chosen to come to BYU this summer. Please read the following information carefully. If you have questions, please contact us. We look forward to your participation.

RECEIPT

You should have received an e-mail or mailed receipt upon registration, **please verify that all information (camp dates, payment amount, etc.) is correct.** Please notify us if you see an error.

ADMISSION AND STANDARDS

Brigham Young University's Division of Continuing Education is committed to providing a learning atmosphere that reasonably accommodates persons with disabilities who are otherwise qualified to attend. Prior to registration, all applicants with disabilities may discuss the program requirements and available facilities with the applicable program director.

Participants attending these programs must maintain the standards of Brigham Young University (i.e., high standards of honor, integrity, language, and morality; abstinence from tobacco, alcohol, coffee, tea, and harmful drugs; and modesty in dress).

Shorts worn in other areas on campus must be knee-length. Sleeveless shirts or tank tops are not allowed. Dress standards are strictly enforced in the cafeterias and on the main campus. Dancewear is acceptable only in the dance classes.

A clean and well-cared-for appearance should be maintained. Hairstyles should be clean and neat, avoiding extreme styles. Men's hair should be trimmed above the collar, leaving the ear uncovered. Earrings for men are unacceptable, and men are expected to be clean-shaven. Beards are therefore not acceptable, except for documented medical reasons that must be coordinated with Conferences and Workshops.

The following are the responsibilities of each participant: Maintain respectful attitudes toward faculty, instructors, counselors, and all other individuals; demonstrate proper use of university equipment and facilities; attend all camp sessions and activities; follow instructions; respect curfews; dress modestly; refrain from vulgar and profane language; and come prepared to observe the BYU Honor Code.

Any participant involved in theft; the illegal use of drugs; consumption of alcohol; infraction of dormitory rules, curfew, or BYU standards; or any other unlawful or immoral act will be sent home and/or prosecuted. No refunds will be given for those asked to leave the program because of these violations. Parents are responsible for picking up a participant who has been dismissed and for paying any costs incurred for transportation. Due to safety and liability concerns, participants found in or entering campus construction areas will be subject to immediate dismissal without a refund.

CANCELLATIONS AND REFUNDS

Only a participant and his or her parents/guardian have authority to request a refund. A non-refundable handling fee of \$50 will be assessed on all cancellations requested by 5:00 p.m. two weeks before the camp begins. No refunds will be given after this deadline. For example, if you are attending the Theatre Camp beginning Monday, June 23, refunds will not be given after 5:00 p.m. Friday, June 6. Brigham Young University cannot be held responsible for any change or cancellation charges made or required by airlines, travel agencies, or other institutions.

The refund process will take between 14-21 working days. You will be reimbursed in the same way you paid your camp tuition.

FOOD AND HOUSING

Participants purchasing the housing package will stay in BYU residence halls; the cost includes breakfast, lunch, and dinner, and counselor supervision. A key for their room/hall will be given to each participant. Please be aware that there is a \$30 fee for lost room keys.

Commuting participants will receive lunch daily.

Roommates are assigned by the camp staff (*unless a roommate is requested upon registration*). You will be assigned a roommate who is attending the same camp.

Members of the opposite sex are not allowed in personal rooms for any reason, but are welcome in the main floor lobby areas during visitor's hours. Violations will result in immediate dismissal from the program without a refund. Participants will be liable for any damage they cause to university property, equipment, or facilities.

Each room has two single beds, desks, clothes closet and mirrors. A furnished linen packet includes sheets, towels, washcloth, pillowcase, pillow and blanket. Three double-occupancy rooms will share one bathroom facility. (There are no private baths.) There is only one towel change on Wednesday so you may want to bring an extra towel from home. The halls are air-conditioned, but it can be hot. You may want to bring a small fan from home.

Suggested items to bring

- Journal
- Large water bottle
- Light Jacket/Sweater
- Other toiletry items as needed (hairspray, hairdryer, deodorant, etc.)
- Scriptures (Bible, Book of Mormon, D&C, Pearl of Great Price)
- Shampoo, conditioner, soap
- Shoes (including those for concerts, dance classes, casual wear, etc.)
Flip Flops are okay for residence halls only
- Small amount of spending money
- Small fan (residence halls can get hot)
- Sunscreen
- Swimming Suit (*no bikinis*)
- Sweats/Lounging Wear/Robe
- Towels

MEALS FOR NON-HOUSING PARTICIPANTS

All camps offer lunch either in the campus all-you-can-eat cafeterias or on site. Some camp packages include a barbeque or banquet, these are for ALL participants. Please visit the **Special Features** link for more information.

EARLY ARRIVALS

Please contact BYU Student Auxiliary Services to arrange for early-arrival housing. Meals are available in the all-you-can-eat cafeterias for a moderate price. Early-arriving participants staying in campus housing must be officially registered in a camp program with their registration fee paid in full. Participants arriving early will be expected to maintain BYU standards, observe the residence hall curfew of 10:30 p.m., and pay a special housing fee that covers the cost of lodging. They will be responsible for arranging and paying for their own meals until the program officially begins.

LATE ARRIVALS

If you are going to arrive late, please call 801-422-7692 and inform us of your approximate arrival time.

TRAVEL

Check-in for most camps will be from 9:00–10:45 a.m. on Monday *with the exception of Theatre and Summer Festival participants who check in on Sunday evening*. PARKING AND PARTICIPANT PERSONAL VEHICLES

We do not encourage you to bring your cars to campus. If you need to bring a vehicle please park in the C lots around the residence halls. You are not allowed to use your car to transport other participants during the camp. *Participants staying in the residence halls are required to give their keys to their counselor until Saturday morning.*

You are not allowed to go off campus unless you have a parental release form stating where, with whom, and when you will be gone.

AIR TRAVEL

If you are arriving by plane, a commercial shuttle service is available to transport you from the Salt Lake International Airport to Provo. Advanced reservations are required. Have your flight number and your arrival time ready when you call. Have the driver take you to the BYU HRCN (Heritage Halls Central Building). Please note that BYU is not affiliated with any shuttle services and it is listed for your convenience only.

Driving Instructions

If you are driving to Provo via I-15 southbound or northbound, take the BYU-Orem University Parkway Exit (#269), and head east toward Y mountain–(big Y painted on it).

This street (University Parkway) will take you past University Mall and bring you into Provo. Follow University Parkway past Lavell Edwards Stadium to 900 East. At 900 East and University Parkway turn right. Continue on 900 East; after passing 1430 North make an immediate right into the parking lot. (See HRCN – Heritage Halls Central Building on the [campus map](#).)

You will need to park in this lot and walk to the HRCN. **LEAVE YOUR LUGGAGE IN YOUR CAR** until you receive your building and room assignment. Check-in for participants is in the Heritage Halls Central Building (subject to change).

INSURANCE

BYU Conferences and Workshops provides a limited accident policy for all participants. Any accident related costs beyond the limit of this policy are the responsibility of each participant. Participants must carry primary insurance for the workshop. Medical expenses incurred due to illness are **not** covered. All participants will be treated at the BYU Student Health Center unless the nature of the injury dictates otherwise.

Parents/guardians are responsible for payment of transportation and treatment of their son/daughter. If you are taking medication of any kind, please be sure you indicated this on your registration form. (You can call the registration office at 801-422-8925 if you need to add additional information). This will allow you to receive medical attention more quickly in case of an emergency.

CLIMATE

Brigham Young University is located in Provo, Utah, approximately 4,500 feet above sea level. Summer daytime temperatures range between 80 and 100 degrees and evening temperatures cool to between 55 and 65 degrees (F).
