



## *A What?*

Have two objects at the head of a circle. The person at the head passes the ball to person #1 to their right and says, “here is a banana” (or something else like that). Person #1 being handed the object replies, “a what?” then the first person repeats, “a banana!” Then person#1 object then turns to the person #2 to their right and says, “here is a banana.” Person #2 replies, “a what?” and then person #1 turns to the person who first handed them the object and says, “a what?” The first person then responds to person #1, “a banana.” Person #1 turns to person #2 and says, “a banana.” Person #2 turns to person #3 and says, “here is a banana.” Person #3 says, “a what?” then each person says “a what” all the way back to the first person. So it should sound like this “a what,” “a what,” “a what,”—“a banana,” “a banana,” “a banana,”—“here is a banana”(this is where person #3 is talking to person #4). This is repeated while going from person to person around the circle. When the object gets about a quarter of the way around the circle, then the person that started will begin another object going the opposite way.
