

# SUPER FUN

## Materials:

Two large sheets per square, one large ball per square, two 30' ropes, and a bunch of people

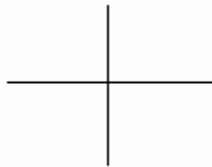
## Object:

Keep the ball from landing in your square by catching it in the sheet

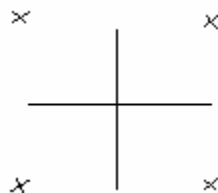


## How to Play:

Split your entire group into two smaller groups. Each small group will have a sheet. Have each person in the smaller groups grab an end of their sheet when instructed to do so by the BC. Place the ball in the middle of the sheet of one of the groups. The BC in charge will have a game area set up with the rope in the shape of a four square game. As shown here in this example:



Your entire group will be in one of these squares, while the other groups will be in each of the other squares. When the BC gives the signal, the small group with the ball in its blanket will attempt to launch the ball to any of the other squares. Simultaneously, both of your small groups will be trying to catch the balls that are being launched into their square and launching them into other squares. Counselors, you will be the judges for the out of bounds. I know that this is a heavy responsibility because the youth might get very passionate about the game. The best way to watch the out of bounds line is to stand at the outer points of the squares. As shown here (one of you will be standing where the x's are):



Every time the ball lands in your square a point is given to you. The team with the lowest points will win the game. The counselor that isn't watching the out of bounds will be keeping track of the points. Remember, this is meant for having fun and working as a group, not just winning. Most of the points in this will be awarded for teamwork, sportsmanship, and cheering.

**Rules:**

- If the ball hits one of the inner lines it is considered out and the team that launched the ball will get the point-remember points are bad
- Be honest, points will be deducted in large amounts if any cheating is seen by the BC
- No spiking the ball, it needs to be launched upward
- A group may only cross the line if they are trying to catch a launched ball, but when launching a ball they need to be on their side of the line
- There are no height restrictions
- Boys and girls should be divided up evenly among the two small groups

**Procedure:**

- Go to your assigned square and divide your group into the two smaller groups
- Do not touch the blankets or ball until the BC tells you to, points will be deducted if youth are seen playing with these items
- One of the counselors should get into the out of bounds judge spots
- Have fun, since this game is *Super Fun!*
